- Assist students in becoming information literate, critical thinkers
- Provide a physical environment conducive to study, interaction, and social and intellectual exchange

- Broader collaboration between academic, public, special and school librarians

- New approaches to the design and delivery of core library services
- Shift from the creation and management of on-site collections to the design and delivery of library services

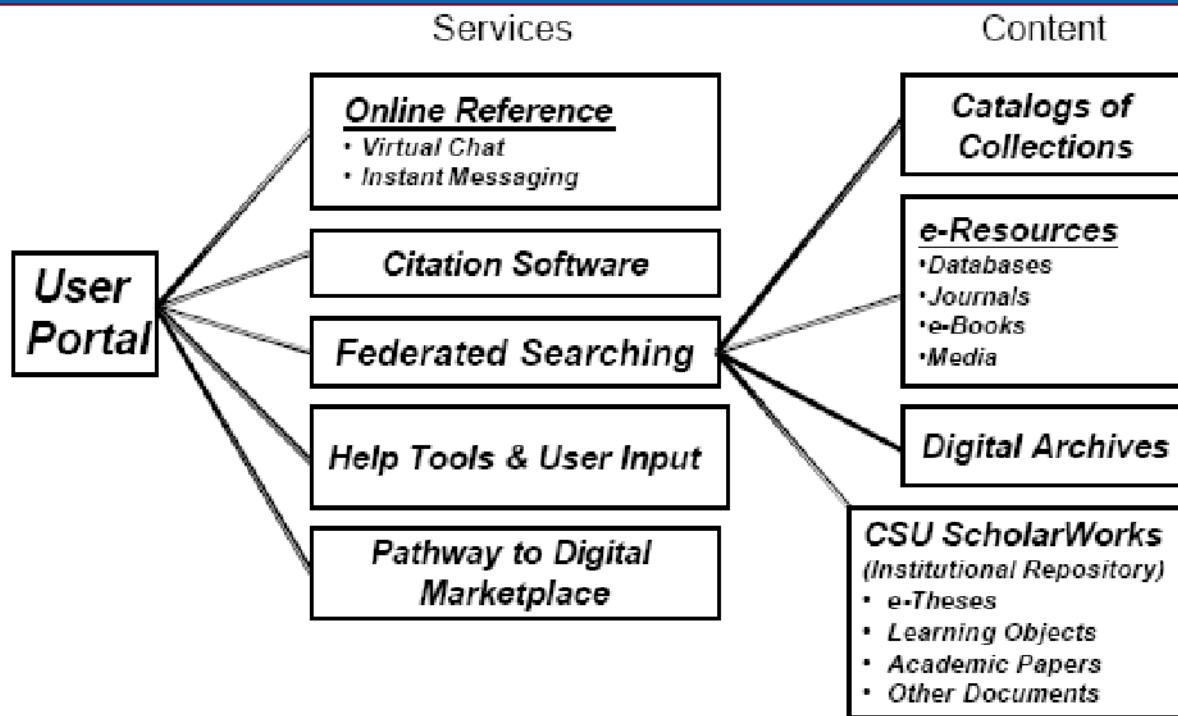
- Providing uninterrupted access to resources

Library Facilities

- Traditional library building function
 - Collection storage and retrieval
 - Reference consultation and bibliographic instruction
 - Study space
- Transformation of library building use
 - Continue to serve the above listed function
 - Remote access reference services
 - Ask Librarians, chat, blogs
 - Collaborative learning space, computer access, student advising, and technology assistance

Library Facilities

- Features to consider in new/renovated space
 - Collection storage space (open or closed)
 - User space
 - Individual, group studies, instruction/consultation
 - Computer commons
 - Production and presentation space
 - Social space, coffee shop and/or café
 - Technology infrastructure

Library Facilities

➤ Changing Perceptions of Libraries

- Library “as a place to learn, as a place to read, as a place to make information freely available, as a place to support literacy, as a place to provide research support, as a place to free computer/internet access..” (College Students’ Perceptions of Libraries and Information Resources, OCLC, 2005)
- “... physical facilities to foster individual and collaborative teaching and learning and to encourage the exchange of ideas.”(CSUEB mission statement)
- “...a physical environment designed to maximize learning, nurture the production and distribution of new knowledge, and stimulate and sustain innovation.” (UNR Knowledge Center)
